# GIGI'S KITCHEN

## Lemon Chicken Brochettes



### *Ingredients*

4 boneless chicken breasts  
10 slices of preserved lemon

### Marinade:

1/2 cup of olive oil  
3 tablespoons of fresh lemon juice  
3 garlic cloves cut in half  
2 tablespoons of large lemon zest  
(use a potato peeler)  
1/2 teaspoon of dried oregano  
1/2 teaspoon of dried thyme  
1/4 teaspoon of sea salt  
1/2 teaspoon of  
freshly ground pepper

### *Instructions:*

1. Cut your chicken breast in large cubes, and place the cubes in a large Ziploc bag.
2. Add all the ingredients for the marinade to the Ziploc bag. Close the bag and massage marinade onto the chicken. Refrigerate for 1 hour.
3. While chicken marinates, soak 4 wooden skewers in cold water.
4. After 1 hour, place chicken and half lemon slices on skewers, alternating chicken and lemon.
5. Heat your grill then turn the burners under the brochettes to low, leave the other burners (the ones that are not directly under the chicken) on high. Cook for about 20 minutes, until chicken is cooked, turning when needed.
6. Let chicken rest for 5 minutes covered with aluminium paper, then serve.

## The History of Father's Day



*Have you ever wondered why we celebrate Father's Day?*

*Read below to find out why this day has become a highly celebrated holiday around the world.*

*Do you know when Father's Day became official?*

A woman by the name of Sonora Smart Dodd came up with the idea of honoring and celebrating fathers while listening to a Mother's Day sermon at church in 1909. Sonora had lost her Mom and was raised by her Dad with her brothers and sisters.

She felt as though mothers were getting all the claim while fathers were equally deserving of a day of praise.

Her Dad's birthday being in June, she chose June to celebrate all American Fathers. A beautiful homage to her Dad!

It's only in 1957 (almost 30 years later) that Senator Smith established Father's Day in all States. "If we celebrate our Mothers, let's do the same with our Dads or we don't do it at all!"

It took time for every one to get familiarized with the idea.
