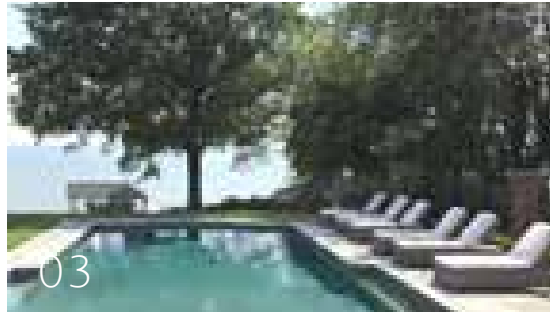

Gigi's Kitchen

INGREDIENTS

15 scallops
 10 strands of saffron
 1 pound turnip greens
 1 lemon
 1 small handful of cilantro
 2 tablespoons minced shallot
 1/4 cup dry vermouth
 2/3 cup heavy cream
 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
 1 tablespoon butter
 1 teaspoon turmeric
 Salt and pepper

SAFFRON TURNIP VELOUTE WITH SCALLOPS

This savory dish is a French seafood starter that is sure to delight.

PREP TIME: 15 MINUTES

COOK TIME: 15 MINUTES

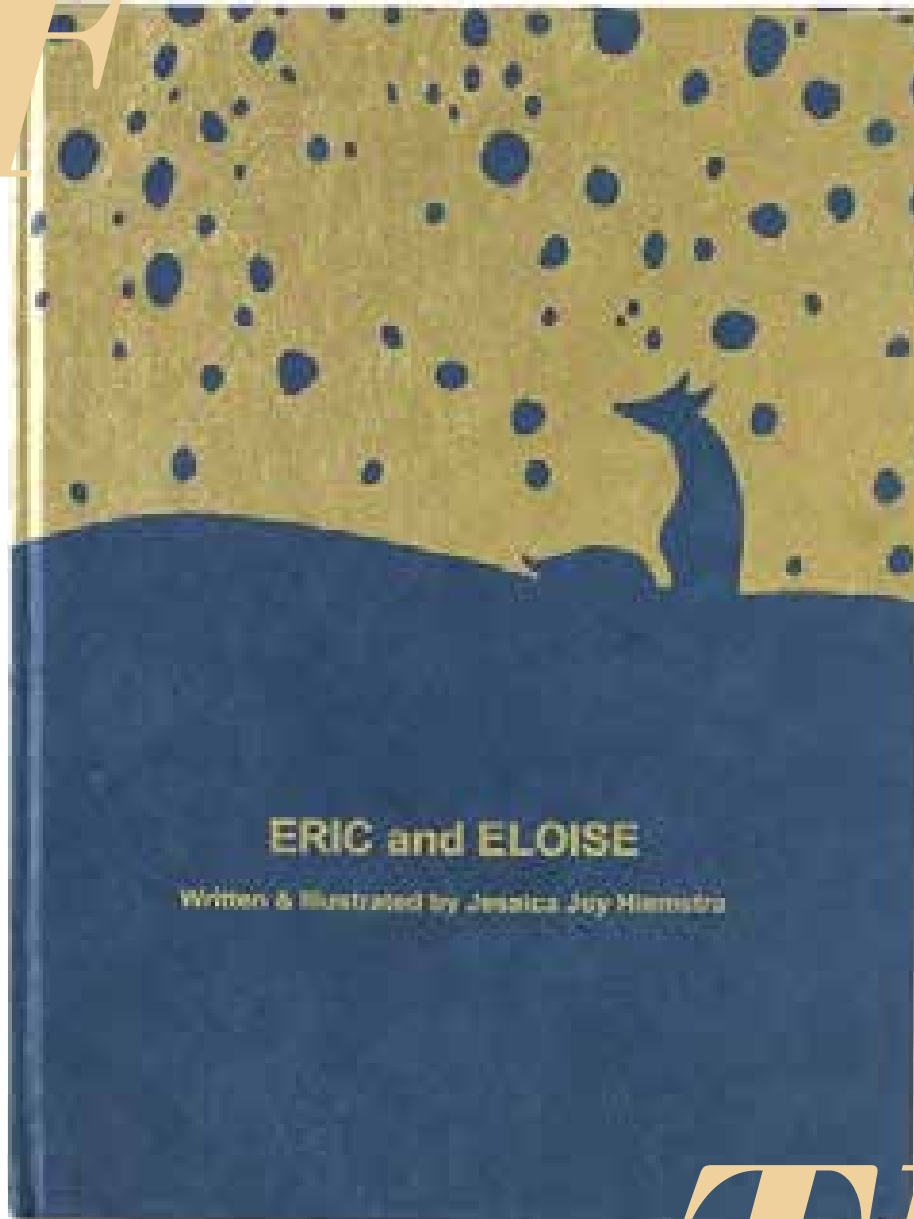
TOTAL TIME: 30 MINUTES

INSTRUCTIONS

Heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil with turnip greens in a skillet, cooking until tender. In a saucepan, heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil. Add scallops to the pan, cooking over high heat. Transfer the scallops to a plate and melt the butter in the skillet. Add the shallot and cook over medium-high heat. Sprinkle saffron into heavy cream. Add the vermouth and saffron cream. Squeeze the lemon and simmer. Plate the turnip greens and scallops, pouring the veloute overtop. Sprinkle with saffron and cilantro. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Enjoy!

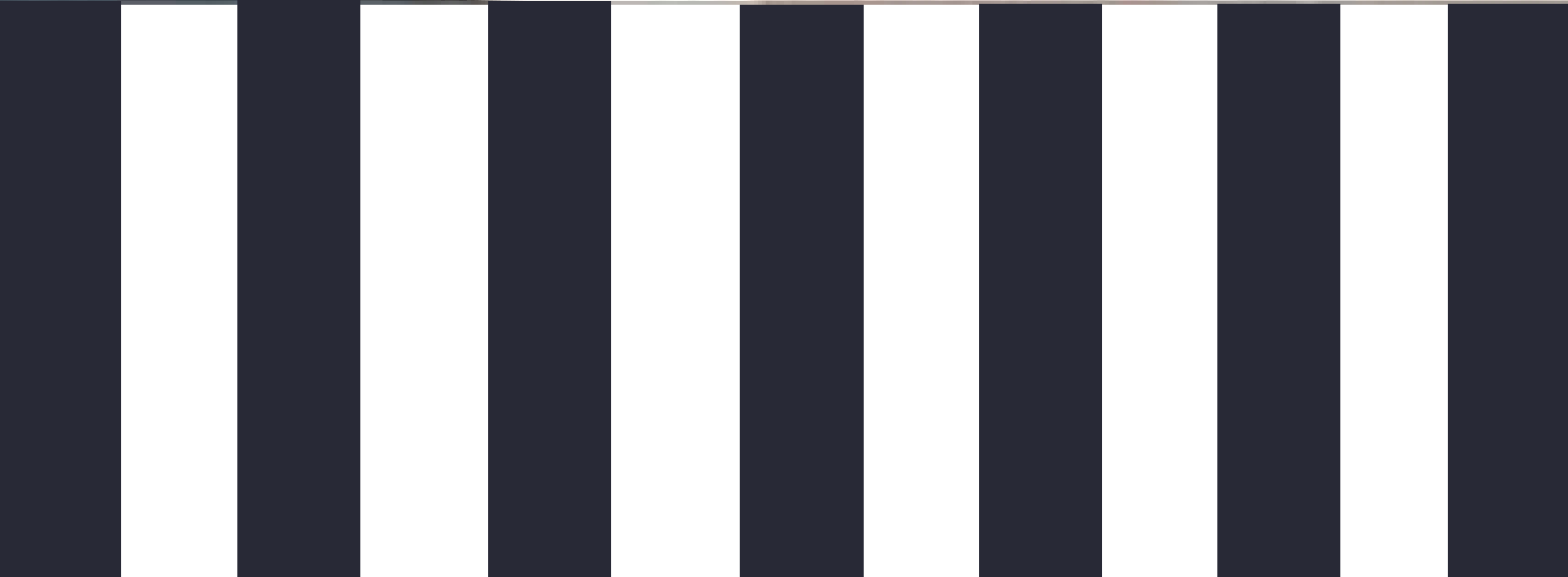
